**1. Construction Update**

**C. Carr**

- a. Induction rooms are not ready for occupancy. Carole Wehmeyer is working with building services. No move in date yet. Inductions will continue in Zones III and IV for now.
- b. Construction for CT moving to front of department continues. Potential to move in November/December time frame. CT technologists will be expected to learn operation of all 3 CT scanners for DCH. Each scanner has a different operating platform.

**2. Sedation Update**

- a. Lessons learned from recent Code Blue during induction in Zone IV
  - i. Technologists were great at getting patient to safe area for code and securing Zone IV doors
  - ii. Need to assign a recorder – Carole assigned Radiology Charge Nurse the responsibility to record
  - iii. Respiratory therapists need help to learn the location of supplies for Anesthesiologist
  - iv. Someone needs to take responsibility for crowd control. Once all the necessary help is there, others need to leave. Carole and Wilma will learn the rules and report back.
  - v. Mock Code request may be a problem as they are moving to simulators and limited locations. We will need to have our own practice walk through of code situations as we work our way through construction situations. Wilma and Carole will work on this.

**3. Shriners Update**

- a. All DPI physicians have privileges with Shriners through October 31, 2019.
- b. Drs. Ey, Warren, Pianki and Roebel have completed the full privileging packets and were submitted to Shriners in mid-September.

**4. Professionalism Statement**

**E. Ey**

- a. Dr. Ey distributed a new Professionalism Statement from DCH that is the expectation for behavior by all practitioners and advanced practice professionals at DCH. **This statement is attached.** Let Dr. Ey know of any questions.

**5. Transport for MI – Policy Changes**

- a. Scheduling NICU patients referred for imaging from outside hospitals will be made through the Comm Center and will include Neonatologist, NICU team lead nurse, respiratory/transport coordinator, and radiology scheduler. Neonatologist will meet with Transport Team in Radiology to assess patient. Neonatologist does not need to remain with patient and will give a phone number for immediate consultation if there is a problem. Any patient requiring sedation will need to be scheduled with Anesthesia department. Any patient already intubated will be transferred to NICU at DCH before imaging.

**6. Ohio State Medical Board CME Requirement Changes**

**E. Ey**

- a. Starting October 16, 2019, Ohio physicians will need to complete a total of 50 hours Category 1 CME every two years to be eligible for license renewal in Ohio.
- b. Previously, physicians were required to complete a total of 100 hours, of which 40 needed to be Category 1.

**7. New Protocol Brain for Seizure**

**E. Ey**

- a. The new Seizure Protocol requested by Dr. Kumar, Chair of Pediatric Neurology, has been created and announced to the radiologists to review by Andrea Lillie. There are 3 sequences and each is reformatted into axial, sag, and cor planes. Each sequence takes 5-6 minutes to complete. If the patient cannot be still for that length of time, the technologist will revert to the prior seizure protocol. The new protocol does not include IV contrast for initial seizure work up.

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Ohio's law regarding continuing education for physicians will change in October.

Starting October 16, 2019, Ohio MDs, DOs, and DPMs will need to complete a total of 50 hours Category 1 CME every two years to be eligible for license renewal in Ohio. Previously, physicians were required to complete a total of 100 hours, of which 40 needed to be Category 1.

Additionally, the amount of continuing education hours a physician may earn providing health care services as a volunteer will be reduced to three hours.

Once the statute has taken effect, Ohio Revised Code 4731.282 (50-hour CME requirement) and 4745.04 (volunteer CE credits) will be updated. Information on laws and rules for licensees is also available in the [LAWS & RULES](#) section on [med.ohio.gov](http://med.ohio.gov).



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
